1. • •	Welcome & Introductions – Dr. Kamana Beamer, Former & Acting Chair Welcome Confirm Quorum Review & Approve Minutes from July 28, 2014 Preview Agenda		Meeting started at 4:10 by Matt until Dr. Beamer arrived. Welcome, pule & introductions. Quorum confirmed. Approved 7/28/14 minutes to post on both WMS and HC websites. No revisions to the agenda.

2. •	Principal's Update – Matt Horne Beginning of School Update New Staff & Partnerships	 MHorne provided brief overview: Longer school day – some say it's "wearing on students and teachers" Added A&B Periods – Interventions & Exploratories 	
		 Introduced Positive Behavior rewards system seems to be popular with students and beneficial – based on I KAIR Core Values – over 50 students redeemed 5+ positives last Friday and very well received at Crazy Olympics assembly. School fully staffed – excited about new faculty and staff A number of new partnerships including PD trainers that will work with faculty throughout the school year Natalie Nimmer will be working with faculty-staff on Accreditation Implementation Groups throughout the year 	
•	Accreditation – Action Plan Implementation Focus Groups (attached)	Reviewed status of Accreditation: reminded all that it's a 6-year process but requires continuous attention because we will be visited and/or reports required and we must be prepared to demonstrate progress throughout the 6 years. Major emphasis of Accreditation visiting committee recommendations was related to instruction (6 of 8 recommendations) and financial sustainability and fundraising (2 of 8 recommendations). Commented on "Commendations" school received – (1) the inclusiveness of our process – we were a "model" school in this regard; and (2) high level of community involvement in the	

		school.	
•	Family Open House (Wed., August. 27 5-7:15 pm) - LAP Participation	Reviewed plans and invited all to attend. Asked Colin Miura as Chair-Elect to speak briefly; he agreed to.	
		Agenda interrupted for group to thank Dr. Beamer for his 2 years of service. Very warm Mahalo expressed for supporting school through challenging times and also wishing Dr. Beamer well as he moves on. He also promised to come back "when needed."	
3.	Ho'okako'o Local School Board & Charter Update – Guy Kaulukukui, Interim HC Executive Director	GKaulukukui provided brief HC update; explained status of HC/KS partnership – three years now w/o KS funding to HC; hopes to have this resolved and new MOUs in place soon.	
		Commended that WMS Accreditation mandates sustainability planning and fundraising – suggested we should include increasing enrollment as one of our strategies, ie, develop a student recruiting strategy. All agreed.	
		Briefly discussed some of HC challenges, ie., "legacy issues" with KS, and also such items as having included ELT in their previous Strategic Plan – "didn't articulate the purpose well"	
		Explained that HC Board to participate in new Strategic Planning process; HC is committed to developing school leadership and identifying what it means to be an HC school – incorporating school experiences and areas of excellence/success. May require HC staff restructuring – must look at common barriers schools experience and that need to be addressed to develop HC staff to better relate to and support schools. Want to ensure appropriate administrative functions to support schools.	
		For example, said other 2 schools need a lot of help with finances; WMS is strong here.	
		Also said looking at their expenses – ie, Charter School Network – HC has paid into it but in reality, HC takes care of its schools so not sure about continuing membership. Is there value?	

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		Brief discussion of KS – undergoing major	
		transitions.	
		Kahu Billy Mitchell urged that because we're a	
		charter school, we can't be "status quo" in our	
		thinking. "It's a business." Have to have a	
		business plan. It's a sin to sit w/o a business	
		plan. Should look at what school is "rich" in – he	
		thinks we are "rich" in "community" and	
		"diversity" and "facilities." Explained how his	
		church now views their facilities and opening	
		their doors to other uses. Should look at	
		facilities as an income generator to support	
		sustainability. Classrooms can be used for other	
		purposes. Must get out of the box in our	
		thinking. WMS has some of the prettiest lands	
		in town – flat, accessible.	
		in town – hat, accessible.	
		Also talked about how Dr. Beamer "brought a	
		new consciousness to WMS – intellect is good,	
		learning is good; a fine example of what	
		education can do for you. Not every child will go	
		to Harvard but every student can be successful."	
		No matter what culture, can find success. Said	
		"Your kids love coming to this school."	
		Discussion about how to nurture relationship	
		with KS. Kahu Billy and Dr. Beamer both urged	
		keeping a close tie to Mike Chun. Also,	
		GKaulukukui urged school invite KS' new Hawai'l	
		Island leader Ka'eo Duarte to school for full	
		orientation, and schedule it so that Guy,	
		Kamana, Mike Chun, Kahu Billy and Bob Lindsey	
		available that day to have lunch with him.	
		(Kamana said Mondays and Tuesdays are best	
		for him for this.) Goal for this is to help Ka'eo	
		become a friend and advocate for WMS.	
		CMundon mentioned that in the past, KS also	
		provided PD support for school – interested not	
		just in funding but also PD support.
