'Malama Honua'Sustainability



7th and 8th grade students in Mrs. Jamilynn Mareko's Future Bound Exploratory spent first semester examining the deeper meaning and importance of the World Wide Voyage's "Malama Honua" theme of caring for our natural resources to sustain us today and for future generations. Throughout the semester the class spent time working in Mala'ai school garden, where Garden Leader Holly Sargent-Green introduced them to the process of decomposition. As a culminating class project, students created this local-style **Decomposition Timeline**. They gathered island-style trash to create this eyeopening exhibit to help raise awareness with fellow students, families and the community and it's pretty shocking to learn how long items take to decompose — for example, a rubber slipper takes 50-80 years to decompose!

WMS students who have exemplified one or more of the school's core values – 'Ike, Kaizen, Accountability, Integrity and/or Respect – during the school day or in one of our many extracurricular programs will be recognized at this Friday's end-of-semester I KAIR Awards Assembly. school budget. But after hours, in addition to being a wife and young mom, Aunty Pristeen's hobby is powerlifting. In fact, at the recent World Association Benchlifters Deadlifters League (WABDL) Championships in Las Vegas, she broke her own State record of deadlifting 330 pounds by deadlifting 358 pounds, thereby capturing 1st Place in the Submaster Women (33-39-year-old) bracket! This was the top ranking in her age division and it means she automatically quali-

fies for the 2015 WABDL World Championships.

As always, each competitor was given 3 lifts and Aunty Pristeen's were: 319 pounds, 341 pounds and 358 pounds. Her final lift also qualified her for **3**rd **Place in the Open** (women of all ages) competition that included wahine athletes from the USA, New Zealand, Finland and Brazil.


There to watch and cheer for her were her husband, **Keola**, a close friend/college roommate, and her trainer, **Bill Case** (**Pua Case's** brother) from **Waimea's Five Mountain Fitness** gym.

Also, because this was the first time WABDL hosted a "live internet feed" of the event, her mom, grandmother and other family members were able to watch from here in Hawai'i as was our office team including **Principal Matt Horne, VP Amy Kendziorski, Tanya Malani** and **Bernie March** because the flight was aired about 3 in the afternoon.

So what was the most impressive thing about the competition? Aunty Pristeen said there was one woman from Brazil (not in her age group) who lifted 500 pounds! The other notable thing was just being in the company of so many strong, competitive men and women, many of whom were speaking foreign languages.

And what's next? For the growing number of powerlifters in Waimea including Aunty Pristeen, there will be a sanctioned event in **Hilo in February 2015**.
