





Every school day counts in a child's academic life...

A missed school day is a lost opportunity for students to learn, so it's not surprising that there is a positive correlation between student attendance and student achievement.

The US Department of Education, National Center for Educational Statistics reports:

"While teacher effectiveness is the strongest school-related determinant of student success,¹ chronic student absence reduces even the best teacher's ability to provide learning opportunities. Students who attend school regularly achieve at higher levels than students who do not have regular attendance."

Dr. Kenneth Fischer Named To Ho'okako'o Corp. Local School Board For Three Public Conversion Charter Schools Including WMS - Serving 1,500+ Students

Dr. Kenneth Fischer, a Waimea optometrist and community leader, has been invited by **Ho'okako'o Corp**. to serve on the local school board for Waimea Middle School, Kualapu'u Elementary School on Moloka'i, and Kamaile Academy in Waianae.

The appointment, recommended by **WMS' Local Advisory Panel (LAP)**, was announced by **Ho'okako'o Corp's Chair Ann Botticelli.** Ho'okako'o has served as WMS' local school board – in lieu of the State Board of Education – since 2003 when WMS opted to become a public conversion charter school under a new law passed by the 2002 State Legislature.

"I am committed to supporting the children and families of Waimea Middle School, which became the first public school in the state to 'convert' to charter status in 2003 to assume more local responsibility for school leadership and academic progress. This is essential if our children are to be prepared for the exciting college and career opportunities available to them in the 21st century," said Dr. Fischer.

"Every school can be even better and I look forward to working both with the Ho'okako'o Board and school leadership in Waimea as well as at Kualapu'u and Kamaile schools to help further raise the bar," he said.
