This past weekend we learned terrific news. It's been touch-and-go to this point, but thanks to the hard work of our **Sen. Malama Soloman** and **Rep. Cindy Evans**, **\$9.89 Million** has been secured for WMS in the final **2014 Legislative Budget** Document (HB 1700 CD 1). There is still a final review and approval process which will occur today (Tues., April 29), but it's looking *very* promising! With the Legislature set to close officially tomorrow (Wednesday, April 30), all decisions will be finalized soon.

Here's our appropriation in the budget document (all numbers are x \$1,000):

70. WAIMEA MIDDLE SCHOOL, HAWAII - CONSTRUCTION AND EQUIPMENT FOR A SPECIALTY AND SUPPORT CLASSROOM BUILDING; GROUND AND SITE IMPROVEMENTS; EQUIPMENT AND APPURTENANCES.

If that's not exciting enough, **Gov. Neil Abercrombie** recently released the **\$5 Million** the Legislature appropriated last year and here's a snippet from an e-mail sent by the **DOE Facilities Branch** to the **Senate Ways and Means Committee** with an anticipated timetable providing the funding is secured:

- a. Design completion by June 2014
- b. Hopefully, Governor releases funding by Sept. 2014
- c. EA expected by June/July 2014.
- d. Plan Review Approval: 1 Month (After June 2014 Design Completion)
- e. Building Permit Approval: 3 Months (After Plan Review Approval)
- f. Project put out to bid in October, assuming plans are completed and the Governor releases the funding in September.
- g. Per the above, construction could start in Jan. 2015
- h. Construction estimated at 360 working days to complete (Original Design).

This timetable seems very optimistic, but we're hopeful and so far so good! We ask everyone to please — when you see Sen. Solomon and Rep. Evans — thank them profusely!
