B.	Kamaile Academy Principal's Report (P. Kepka)	P. Kepka presented the attached Principal's Report with the following highlights.  1. The P-12 Inquiry has begun with Islander Institute. P. Kepka thanked the board for their support.  2. P. Kepka reported a positive school climate on the campus despite the recent violence in the community. Disciplinary referrals are down. The school is experiencing younger learners with behavioral needs.  3. The field restoration project is nearing completion.  4. P. Kepka gave an update on the school's CSI status for the Elementary program.  5. Attendance continues to be an issue.  6. Title I CAP is due for Commission soon. It will be sent to the board by 3/25/24 for review and approval.  7. The school's admission policy is being updated. A draft will be forwarded to the board for review and comment. Action will be taken at the 5/28/24 board meeting. P. Akaka urged P. Kepka to ensure the LAP has reviewed the draft before sending it to the board.  8. Pre-K expansion seems to be on hold.
