the support of families and the community, decided not to furlough kids. But not only did the school have to find funding to remain open and provide busing, it also had to figure out how to feed students because the DOE wouldn't allow the cafeteria crew to prepare food even though the workers were "on the clock." (Cafeteria staff was mortified not to be able to support students but they were told they absolutely could not serve meals.)

But one of the teachers had an idea. Recalling the "lesson" of the legendary French story about Stone Soup, she suggested making and serving it for a Furlough Friday lunch. Every student and all faculty and staff were asked to contribute one item – a carrot, a potato, an onion, a few herbs, a little sausage, etc. Huge steaming pots of soup were prepared and served and there was plenty for everyone. Word got out about the Stone Soup and local and statewide news media spotlighted the lunch and school for having the local wisdom, courage and resourcefulness to do the right thing for students, both by refusing to furlough kids and by asking everyone to contribute just a little for the benefit of all.

Thus, Stone Soup became a WMS' tradition, so, when science teachers started planning this year's 'Ohana Makahiki Fest, they decided to again make Stone Soup for a whole new generation of students and families – again asking everyone to bring just one item to the benefit of all.
