

## **Text Messaging To WMS Families**

At a recent WMS Local Advisory Panel (LAP) meeting when discussing how to better communicate with WMS families, LAP member and parent Colin Miura suggested <u>texting.</u> He said that for him and many of his co-workers and friends, it's the best means of communicating.

As a school, WMS uses **School Connects** to make phone calls and send emails to families but it turns out that this service also offers texting. BUT...the law requires recipients to request texts...we can't just send them.

So, we are now asking WMS families to request receiving school Text Messages. They will be especially useful during emergencies but also for quick advisories or reminders about important school news.

#### Here's how easy it is to request Text Messages from WMS:

- From an **SMS-capable telephone** where you want to receive Text Messages from WMS, text the word **Join** to the number: **56360**.
- If the school's messaging system finds a match for your phone number in its database, you will receive a confirmation message thanking you for joining WMS' school alerts.
- If the school's messaging system (which relies on numbers provided by families) does not find a match for your phone number in its database, you will receive a message that the number could not be found, and you should contact the school office to add the number to the school's student/family contact information. After your number has been added, please wait at least 24 hours, and then text **Join** again.
- If you create a **Contact** on your phone with the name of **Waimea Middle School** and the phone number **56360**, then, when you or a family member receives a text from this number, you will know who is sending it.
- At any time, you can unsubscribe by texting Stop to the same number.

Please note: There is no charge for this service from the school but depending on your phone data plan, there may be a charge from your provider. It is entirely up to families to decide if you wish to sign up for text messages.
